

The Five Conditions of Collective Impact

Common Agenda

All participants have a **shared vision for change** including a common understanding of the problem and a joint approach to solving it through agreed upon actions

Diverse Voices * Responsive * Community Aspiration

Shared Measurement **Collecting data and measuring results consistently** across all participants ensures efforts remain aligned and participants hold each other accountable

Exploring * Alignment * Tracking Progress * Results

Mutually Reinforcing Activities Participant activities must be **differentiated while still being coordinated** through a mutually reinforcing plan of action

Weaving * System * Supportive * Centered

Continuous Communication **Consistent and open communication** is needed across the many players to build trust, assure mutual objectives, and appreciate common motivation

Trust * Transparency * Ongoing * Engagement

Backbone Support Creating and managing collective impact requires a dedicated staff and a specific set of skills to serve as the backbone for the entire initiative and coordinate participating organizations and agencies

Facilitate * Convener * Coordinate * Movement

Guiding Principles

- 1. Believe in and Listen to Young People: as parents, as leaders, as learners, and teachers We will center young parents and meet them as equals with their own expertise, resilience, and strengths.
- 2. Build Trust, Transparency, Consensus, and Respect: for each other and our community We will share hard truths, prioritize connection, ask questions, and stay OPEN to each other's ideas.
- 3. Share Power and Cultivate Inclusive Leadership

We will prioritize equity, seek to serve. and inclusive of <u>all</u> young fathers and mothers

4. Strengthen Collaboration

We will break silos, build cross-sector relationships,

5. Change Systems: Policy, Practice, Culture, and Norms

We will challenge stigma, question the status quo, be anti-racist, and be lead by evidence and data

6. Be Relentless

We will move forward with urgency, push each other, and believe we can succeed.

Problem Definitions

- Neither systems for youth nor systems for adults serve
 - teens who are parents well.
- Unaddressed Widespread and individual trauma makes
 it difficult for young families to thrive.
- Lack family, community, and teen-friendly systems support make it difficult for young parents to navigate toward a positive future.
- Lack of care, understanding, and respect for the capabilities of young parents damages their ability to make a good life.
- Adults do not cultivate and value quality and trustworthy relationships with young parents.
- Educational and healthcare systems and communitybased organizations do not provide a coordinated, comprehensive and teen friendly environment for expectant and parenting teens.

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
